Reset the Photos app

Users running Anniversary (version 1607) or later builds of Windows 10 can reset apps. Here is how to reset the Photos app.

Step 1: [Open Settings](#). Navigate to **Apps > Apps & features**. If you cannot see the Apps category in Settings (happens if you are running Anniversary or earlier builds), please navigate to **System > Apps & features**.

Step 2: Look for the Microsoft Photos app entry. Click on the Photos app to see **Advanced options** link. Click the link to open Storage usage and app reset page.

Step 3: Click the **Reset** button. Finally, click the **Reset** button when you see the confirmation dialog to Reset the Photos app.

Email regarding password is known to scammer

Received call that someone had received an email telling them the individual who sent it knew their password. It displayed the password and it was a valid password that this person had used on more than one site.

Email appeared to be from SaveYou94@2275.com. A check for this domain revealed it is not registered so assume it was a spoofed address. Did not see email so wasn't able to check Source information to determine actual sender.

Advised the individual to change password on every login that this account was used on and to use a different password for each account.

It did not appear that any of the accounts had been tampered with.

Possibly a data breach with one of the account sites but since there were multiple accounts with the same password, unable to determine if password was obtained from a specific account.

Had the individual check the browser they use for logging into sites (Chrome) and there were no suspicious extensions.

Hopefully there was nothing installed on the computer so when the individual changed passwords the attacker could capture all the new passwords.

If using Nomorobo for call blocking, if you receive a call that was not blocked you can report it to Nomorobo using a form on their site.

Keep Windows 10 from going to sleep when transferring files from one computer to another over local network. Apparently a file transfer is not seen activity on the computer the files are being copied to so that computer goes to sleep which results in network connection dropping and file transfer stopping.

Changing the Power Options on the receiving computer is not a good option. If this is a recurring copy and it always takes approximately the same time, could set Sleep on the receiving computer to a longer time but seems there should be better option.
