Comments on articles in May Newsletter:

Change passwords: This process is more difficult if you have multiple devices. Many Android devices use your Google account name/password so you may have to change your Google password on phone, tablet, etc. Microsoft account can also be on multiple devices. If you access an email account on phone, tablet, and computer, you will have to change the password on all of those as well. The biggest problem may be remembering which devices the user information is on so you don't forget to change the password on all of them.

Flash Wyze camera to use as webcam

These cameras are not natively designed to work as a webcam but, if you need a webcam, this might be a solution. When no longer needed as a webcam, will have to flash the firmware back to stock firmware to use as designed.

It is recommended to use a different source for microphone and speakers.
Follow up to discussion from February meeting:

Compromised email accounts:

- 1. Message sent to all contacts indicating help needed. Also set up second email account using same name but different email provider. If anyone responded to first message, they were sent a second message using the second email account. Changed password. Received call mid-April because of problem accessing email. Changed password again and sent test message but it did not appear in Inbox. Discovered that Filter had been created which sent almost all email received to Archive folder. A small number of emails were still arriving in Inbox so did not discover the filter initially. Also discovered automatic Forwarding in place so all emails were being forwarded to the email address the hacker created. Believe entry was gained through account on iPhone.
- 2. Talked with another individual who noticed several Mailer Daemon messages in Inbox. Someone gained access to email account and sent message to all contacts indicating a file was available in Dropbox but clicking on link prompted the recipient to enter their email address and password (which is not required to get a file from Dropbox). Mailer Daemon messages disappeared from Inbox and Deleted folder was empty. Also noticed that other messages had been deleted and that several Contacts had also been deleted. Changed password. Using AOL mail and did not have backup of Contacts so had to manually re-add missing Contacts. Sent message folder had not been deleted so was possible to retrieve contact information from previously sent messages.

In both cases the individuals had recently returned from Florida but not sure if	that was a
factor.	

Another hacker attack:

Individual got phone call regarding unusual purchase on his Amazon account - but he doesn't have Amazon account. Caller convinced him his computer had been hacked and caller needed to access his computer in order to check it. When he called me, the caller had had access for several hours. Brought computer home, backed up all data. Plan was to reinstall Windows, programs, and copy data back to computer. However, issue because using Windows Live Mail and could not find way to reinstall that program or to export messages and contacts to another email client. Ran several programs to check for problems and nothing found. Continue to look for alternative to Windows Live Mail.

Still updating Windows 7 computers to Windows 10. Updated my son's laptop and the Windows 7 key was on the bottom of the laptop and some of the letters/numbers were not identifiable. Used a program that finds the key on the computer but it wasn't even close to what was on the sticker. However, was not asked for the key and, after completing the update, Windows 10 was authenticated.
